## Alpha Sigma Welcomes Dedicated KA Brother as Faculty Advisor

Alpha Sigma is both fortunate and honored to have David Carico as our new Faculty Advisor. David joined the Tech faculty after leaving the Kappa Alpha Order's National Office, where he was Executive Director of the Kappa Alpha Order Educational Foundation. During his time with the Educational Foundation, he transformed a department that had net assets of only \$600,000 into a \$6.5 million program.

Born in Thomasville, Georgia, Carico went to Emory University in 1983, where he pursued a dual degree in English and history. During this time, he joined the Epsilon chapter of KA and served as Philanthropy Chair, Rush Chair, Number IV (Corresponding Secretary), and founded the Council of Honor program. He was also the Recipient of the James Grogan Brotherhood Award for "Most Outstanding Member" his senior year.

After graduating in 1987, he served KA National as an Educational & Leadership Consultant for a year before being named Director of Educational Programming. During his

tenure, he was responsible for supervision of traveling staff members, planning the National Leadership Institute and handling risk management and insurance programs. Carico also wrote a number of chapter and advisory guides and manuals. In May 1992, Carico was selected to serve as the Executive Director of the Educational Foundation.

While Executive Director, net assets of the Foundation increased from approximately \$600,000 to \$6,000,000. Additionally, the Foundation's Scholarship program doubled, with the Foundation now awarding over \$100,000 annually to help KAs with their academic pursuits.

Carico is a member of the Hardeman (Georgia) and Wood (Delaware) Province Courts of Honor, has received two Province Commander Commendations and is a recipient of the Knight Commander's Accolade and the Distinguished Service Award.

"During my years at Emory and while I was working for KA, I was always impressed by Alpha Sigma alumni with whom I had contact. I looked at the chapter as a place where young men could have a very enriching KA experience, and I'm happy to lend volunteer time to help in some small way. My experience as a member of Epsilon chapter made a significant impact on me, and I just look at this as a way to give back to an organization that means so much to me."

In December 2002, Carico left the Order's employ and moved to the Georgia Institute of Technology, where he is Director of Development for the Northeastern United States. He represents Tech to alumni in a 13-state region from Kentucky to Maine. The Order's loss is our gain, and we are very grateful to have Carico as our Faculty Advisor.

## **Undergraduate Profile of David Anderson**

# Please give us some background information about yourself.

I grew up in Duluth, Georgia, and graduated from Wesleyan, a small, private high school in northern Atlanta. I have a younger brother, Jim, and two parents, Tom and Ethel. I am a rising fourth year student here at Tech, majoring in financial management.

#### What positions have you held within the Alpha Sigma Chapter and what are some contributions that you have made to the fraternity?

This is my second year serving as Kitchen Manager. I am responsible for the planning, budgeting and day-to-day supervision of KA Dining. During my first semester as Kitchen Manager, we brought in a second food company, igniting what many brothers have called "price wars." Competition gave us good results, so we decided to open up accounts with two specialty food companies – one produce and one dairy – in an attempt to slash prices on certain high margin products by ordering direct from the supplier. Through healthy competition and removing the middle man, we have seen a substantial drop in food costs, while enjoying better quality food and improved customer service.

# With what other organizations have you been involved at Tech?

I am involved in several different campus organizations outside of KA, including SGA, IFC and Presidents' Council Governing Board. I became involved in Student Government my third year here at Tech, having first served as an undergraduate representative for my major. This year, I am serving as Vice President of Finance. My responsibilities include acting as chair of the Joint Finance Committee and overseeing a Student Activity Fee budget of roughly \$3.25 million. In addition, I am working with several administrators on campus initiatives, including a proposed grade substitution policy and an effort to bring a night life to Tech Square.

# This year you have been involved with Johnny Isakson's campaign for the U.S. Senate. What type of role you have played?

It was an honor to be given the opportunity to work on Johnny Isakson's campaign this summer, and it is an experience I will never forget. I was offered a full-time position on the campaign not long after hosting a small, informal rally for Johnny at KA last February. My primary role on the campaign has included attending campaign fundraisers and political events across the state, acting as a surrogate speaker for Johnny at various GOP and town-hall forums, organizing several campaign rallies, and staying in constant contact with county chairs and elected officials to keep them updated on the progress of the campaign. As the summer progressed, I was also placed in charge of overseeing the campaign for Gwinnett County and the creation of a satellite campaign office in Lawrenceville.

# What are your future career goals and do you have any political aspirations?

There are many careers that interest me. I'm sure I would enjoy making a career in politics, whether it meant running for office or serving behind the scenes as a political consultant or advisor to a public figure. However, I am probably more interested in pursuing a career in real estate development, as I have always been interested in that line of work and have enjoyed helping my parents with the purchase and construction of their second home in Florida. Then again, ten years ago, I would have told you that I wanted to be a professional golfer, so who knows where I will end up.
