

# KAs to Choose Fraternity Queen at Annual Formal

The Alpha Sigma Chapter of the Kappa Alpha Order will hold its annual formal dance Friday night, February 15th. Scene of the ball, which promises to be a highlight of the fraternity social season, will be in the Dinkler Room of the Ansley Hotel.

The Metronomes, a well known Atlanta orchestra, will furnish music for dancing at the Kappa Alpha Rose Formal from nine 'til one. Featured event of the ball, from which it derives its name, will be introduction of the new Kappa Alpha Rose, the fraternity sweetheart. President Raymond Faircloth will present, midst a tumultuous clamor of Rebel yells, the new representatives of the fairest flower of the Southland.

Another award made at the dance will be the cup presented to the best all-round of the 1951-52 class. This award will be made to the member-to-be who has been chosen by the fraternity and his pledge mates as the most outstanding in fields of scholarship, work and participation.
